This event is part of the 'Contact, Culture and Conflict around the Causeway' project, which re-examines the legacy of conflict and change in the north of Ireland during the late 16th and early 17th centuries.

During the residential programme, participants will have the opportunity to:

- Meet others with an interest in history and heritage in an inclusive environment;
- Explore skills and concepts relating to archaeology and engage with new archaeological findings;
- Undertake interactive visits at sites across North East Ulster; and
- Handle and explore objects from the plantation period.

Thanks to a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund, the majority of costs for the programme are covered but we would ask for a £10 contribution payable at the event.



Accommodation will be in the Main House at the Corrymeela Centre, Ballycastle. It is possible to participate non-residentially if you live close to the Centre.

Site visits will require strong footwear and warm, waterproof clothing. We will be walking on uneven, muddy ground so please let us know if you have any mobility issues.
