8-12 May A Taste of Spain

A fun introduction to Spanish cooking, both traditional tapas and new Andalusian cuisine. It includes an exploration of food and spirituality, daily cooking workshops, a visit to a white village and a mediaeval olive oil mill, tapas in the village, and time to relax and enjoy Los Olivos and its surroundings. 28 Aug – 1 Sept Meister Eckhart's Book of the Heart: Exploring a Vision of Wholeness in a Time of Fragmentation This retreat will be an opportunity to drink deeply from the wellspring of Eckhart's vision, and allow it to shape-shift our lives into more creative and audacious forms of faithfulness. Bold, courageous, and sometimes outrageous, Eckhart's language continues to be a guiding beacon of light to those seeking to live more authentically, faithfully, freely. Led by Mark Burrow (Bochum University, Germany), co-author of a new book on Eckhart of the same name to be released in the summer of 2017. €475 (DB) / €525 (IN)

11-15 Sept Unruly Women

In the 1650s when an independent London congregation decided that women really should be silent in church, one ordinary woman, Anne Harriman stopped attending and asked that the church hold a debate on the matter, 'for she could not walk where she had not libertie to speak'. Harriman is part of a long line of women struggling with the competing demands of Christianity and culture. In this retreat for men and women we will consider the quandaries and choices of our foremothers in the faith, including women from history and the Bible. 18-22 Sept Enneagram Retreat

What does the Enneagram have to offer those who are committed to a growing relationship with God? This predominantly silent retreat focuses on using the wisdom of the Enneagram to encourage us and is for both beginners and those who already work with the Enneagram. She regularly writes features for the Church Times. Her debut novel *Knowing Anna* was published in 2016 by Marylebone House, London.



Daniel Muñoz, an Anglican priest and theologian, was ordained in the Oxford Diocese in 2001, where he served as a parish priest until 2010. He is the author of *Transformed by the Beloved: a guide to spiritual formation with St. John of the Cross* (BRF, 2014), and recently completed a doctorate on Anglican ecclesiology at the University of Madrid. Daniel is the chaplain and programme director of Los Olivos, as well as associate lecturer of Church History and Ecclesiology at the Protestant Faculty of Theology of Madrid.



Pádraig Ó Tuama is a poet, theologian and retreat leader. He leads the Corrymeela Community, a witness to peace and reconciliation on the north coast of Ireland. His poetry and prose explores story, language and religion. His works include: *In the Shelter* (Hodder & Stoughton and Hachette Ireland, 2015), *Sorry for your Troubles* (Norwich, Canterbury Press, 2013), and *Readings from the Books of Exile* (Norwich, Canterbury Press, 2012). *Poets and the Bible* will be Pádraig's first retreat at Los Olivos.



Liz West has been involved in leadership development with young adults and in church planting. She is working with the Enneagram, seeing it as a tool for her own personal growth and offering this to others of all faiths and none.
