Keynote address by Pádraig, followed by panel discussion.

Leaders: Jo Berry, founder of charity *Building Bridges for Peace*, whose father died in the Brighton bombing and whose dialogue with Pat McGee, sentenced for his part in the bombing has inspired others to choose a non-violent solution: *Finding our own humanity*;

Jude Taylorson, a Zen Buddhist and acupuncturist: *Peace in oneself, Peace in the world*;

Louisa Burnand, of the Centre for Peaceful Solutions, who has worked at Dartmoor prison helping prisoners to develop new ways to communicate:

From Conflict to Contribution – prisoners making a difference;

Jayme Reaves, a public theologian who will include the religious traditions of hospitality as a means to bring people together.

Brother Jonathan Herbert & Brother Hugh, Anglican Franciscan friars from Hilfield Friary Dorset, on *a Franciscan view on peace and reconciliation*.

Pádraig will lead a group on *Brexit and the Book of Ruth.*

The **Multifaith Chaplaincy** of Exeter University: *Creative working in a multifaith team.* The team is celebrating its 10th anniversary as multifaith and is hosting this event

alongside the South West Corrymeela Group.
